
AUTOMATIC SKELETON 2 HANDS WITH DUAL TIME

A) DISPLAY



B) WINDING THE MAINSPRING

Automatic winding watch can be hand wound by turning the crown in it's normal crown position. Wind 15-20 times and it will start to move naturally after shaking slightly.

C) TIME AND DUAL TIME SETTING

I. Time Setting

1. Pull the crown to Position 2.

2. Turn the center hands clockwise to set the Home Time.

3. As the center hands move, the Sun & Moon Display also moves correspondingly.

4. Push the crown back to Position 1 after setting the time.

II. Dual Time Setting

1. Pull the crown to Position 2.

2. Turn the center hands anti-clockwise to set the Dual Time. (The dual time hand at 9 o'clock position will move clockwise simultaneously.)

3. Turn the center hands clockwise to set the Home Time.

4. Push the crown back to normal position after setting the time.

NOTE:

This watch MUST be worn for at least 8 (Eight) hours each day to ensure it is fully wound.

An automatic watch will only wind when the watch is on your wrist and your arm moves.

Winding the watch by the crown will put power on the spring but not enough to allow the watch to function fully. If your watch stops overnight or loses time it means it is not being fully wound.
